1. Welcome to Racket Sports Parent

Racket Sports Parent helps parents organize tournaments, capture what happens during matches, review performance patterns over time, and share useful information with the player's coach.

Parent observes -> App organizes -> Coach interprets -> Player develops.

The goal is not to turn a parent into the coach, but to empower the Player–Parent–Coach Partnership. Racket Sports Parent helps parents record useful, objective information and organize what they observe into meaningful information that can be shared with the coach—giving the coach better insight while allowing each person to stay focused on their proper role.

Observe. Speak. Save. Share.

You do not have to type every observation. Throughout Racket Sports Parent, use your device keyboard's built-in microphone for voice-to-text in text fields to quickly speak notes and observations while they are fresh in your mind. This makes it easier to capture useful information during or immediately after a match. Review dictated text before saving.

What the app helps you do

- Create and maintain player profiles.
- Plan upcoming tournaments and track registration deadlines.
- Record Match Analysis courtside - for a full match or only the portions you are able to record.
- Pause and resume recording when real life interrupts the match.
- Review completed match and tournament reports.
- See Performance Trends across matches and tournaments.
- Compare tournaments side by side.
- Share match and tournament reports with the coach.

One match tells you what happened that day. Performance Trends helps show whether a pattern is developing over time.

2. Getting Started

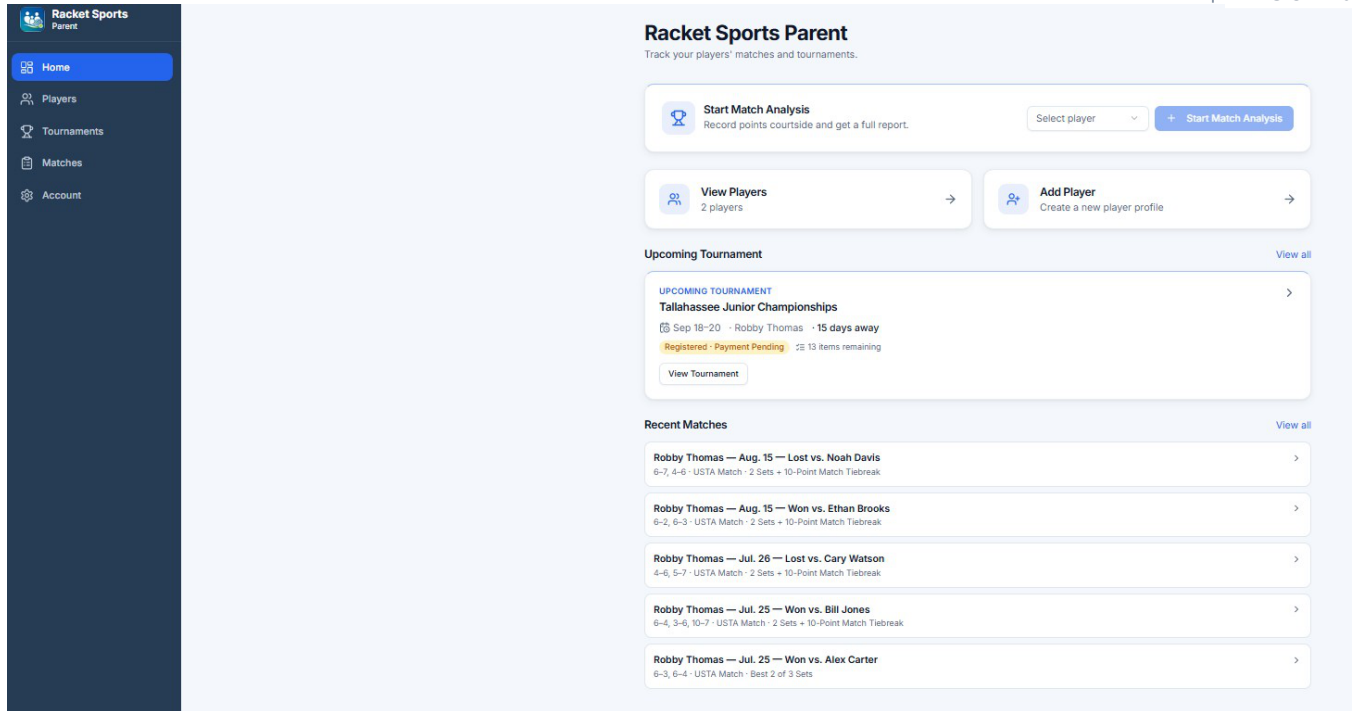
Create your account

Open a new browser tab and enter: racketsportsparent.app

Create your Racket Sports Parent account and follow the on-screen instructions to register and sign in.

Navigating Racket Sports Parent

The left-side navigation is the primary way to move through the app. The main areas are Home, Players, Tournaments, Matches, and Account.



Home provides quick access to players, upcoming tournaments, recent matches, and Match Analysis.

Home

Home is your starting point. From here you can start Match Analysis, open player profiles, review the next upcoming tournament, and return to recent completed matches.

3. Players and Player Profiles

Each player has a profile that keeps tournament and match information organized around that athlete.

Player Information

Player Information can include age, sport, playing level, dominant hand, coach contact information, and optional equipment information such as racket/paddle, string type, and string tension.

Keep player information current. The profile becomes the organizing point for Match Analysis, Performance Trends, and Tournaments.

4. Tournament Planner

Tournament Planner helps you move a tournament through its natural lifecycle: Considering -> Registered -> Completed.

A completed tournament becomes a central record for its matches and Tournament Summary.

After matches are recorded, the tournament page lists each match by round and keeps the Tournament Summary available below.

The Match Analysis button changes with context: before any match is recorded it says Start Match Analysis; after one or more matches are recorded it says Start Next Match Analysis.

5. Starting Match Analysis

Match Analysis begins with a short setup screen. When you start from a tournament, the tournament is already linked to the match.

Setup fields

- Opponent: Existing Player, Guest Player, or Other Opponent.
- Tournament: optional for standalone matches; preselected when started from Tournament Details.
- Round / Match Label: for example Round of 16, Quarterfinal, Semifinal, or Final.
- Match Date and optional Location.
- Match Type and Match Format.
- Who Serves First.
- Optional pre-match notes.

When the setup is correct, select **Start Match Analysis**.

6. Courtside Match Analysis

During a match, record the points you are able to observe. Racket Sports Parent uses those recorded points to build serve, return, shot, direction, error, and observation statistics.

A practical point-entry flow

- Confirm whether the player is serving or receiving.
- Record the serve or return result.
- Record the decisive point-ending shot and outcome when applicable.
- Add an observation or Coaching Tag when something useful stands out.
- Continue to the next point.

Custom Coaching Tags

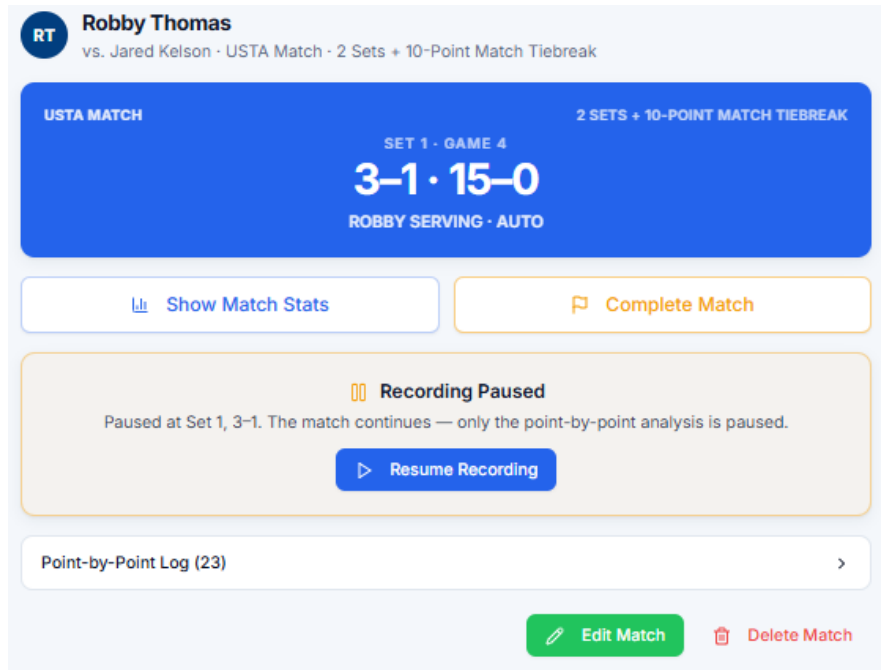
Racket Sports Parent includes built-in Coaching Tags, and you can also create your own reusable tags. Open Manage Tags from the Coaching Tag selector to add, rename, or delete custom tags, hide or unhide default tags, or restore the defaults.

Changing your tag library affects future selections only. Tags already saved on previous Match Analysis points and observations remain unchanged.

You do not have to record every point. The app reports how much Match Analysis data was actually recorded so partial coverage is not presented as a complete match.

7. Pause and Resume Recording

If something comes up during the match, use Pause Recording rather than abandoning the analysis or trying to recreate missed points later.



While paused, the match continues but point-by-point analysis stops.

1. Select Pause Recording.
2. The match continues normally while Match Analysis remains paused.
3. When you are ready, select Resume Recording and enter the current match score.
4. Continue recording from that point forward.

Points played during the pause are not estimated, recreated, or added to the statistics. The completed report clearly states when not all points were recorded.

8. Reviewing a Completed Match

A completed Match Analysis combines the official result entered by the parent with statistics calculated only from the recorded Match Analysis data.

Official result vs. recorded statistics

These are intentionally separate. The official score can represent the complete match even when only part of the match was analyzed point by point.

Example: the final result may be Won 6-3, 6-4 while the performance statistics are based on only 8 recorded points.

When Match Analysis data is recorded across multiple sets, set-by-set statistics may also appear beneath the overall Match statistics. This allows you to see whether performance changed from one set to another.

Understanding denominators

Where a percentage has a meaningful sample size, the report shows the underlying numerator and denominator - for example, 5 of 6 · 83% - rather than displaying the percentage alone.

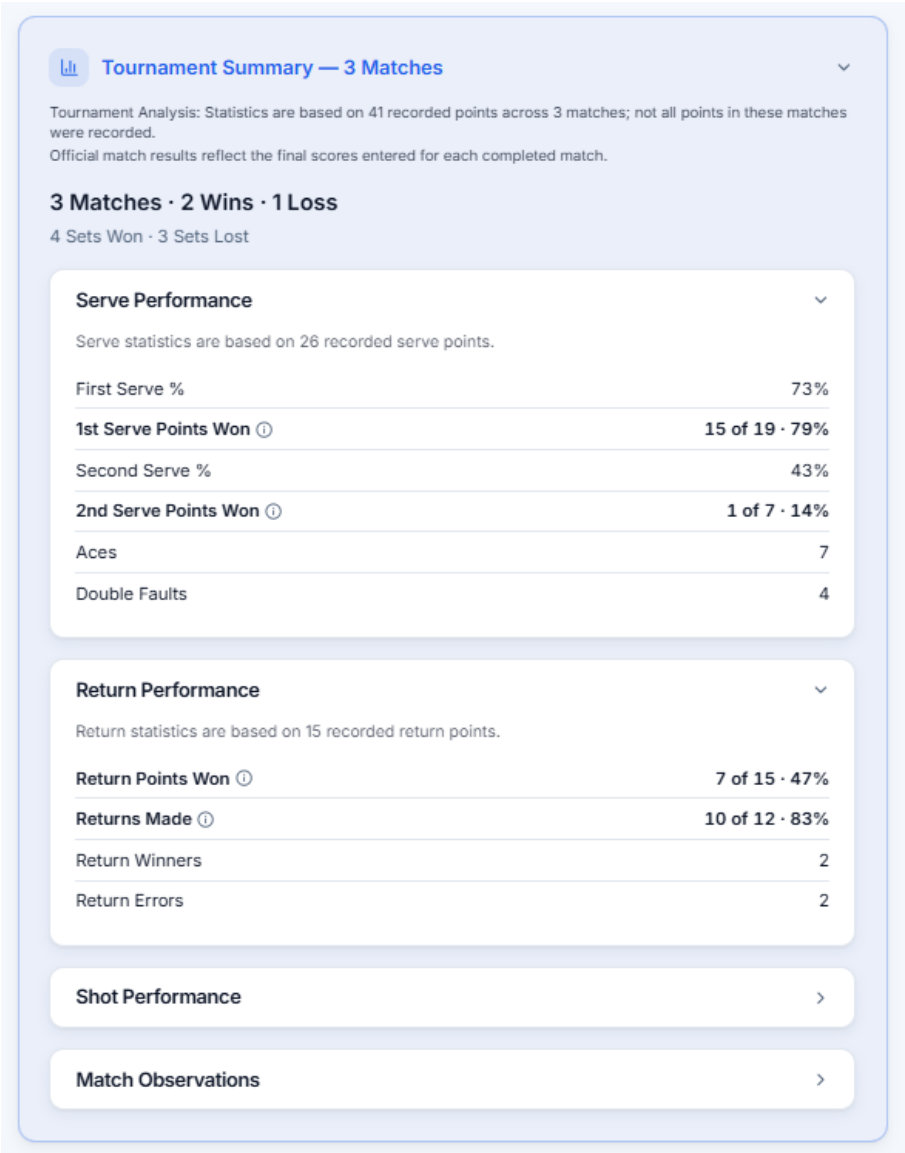
Observations remain tied to the set, game, score, point-ending event, and Coaching Tag.

Observations are most useful when they capture something specific that the coach may want to review - for example late preparation, poor spacing, rushed decision-making, or good preparation.

Parent role: record what you observed. Coach role: interpret what it means and decide whether it should affect training.

10. Tournament Summary

Tournament Summary combines the completed Match Analysis records linked to a tournament. It provides a broader view than any single match.



Tournament Summary with official record plus recorded-data Serve and Return Performance.

The summary distinguishes official match results from recorded performance data. It also states the total number of recorded points across the tournament.

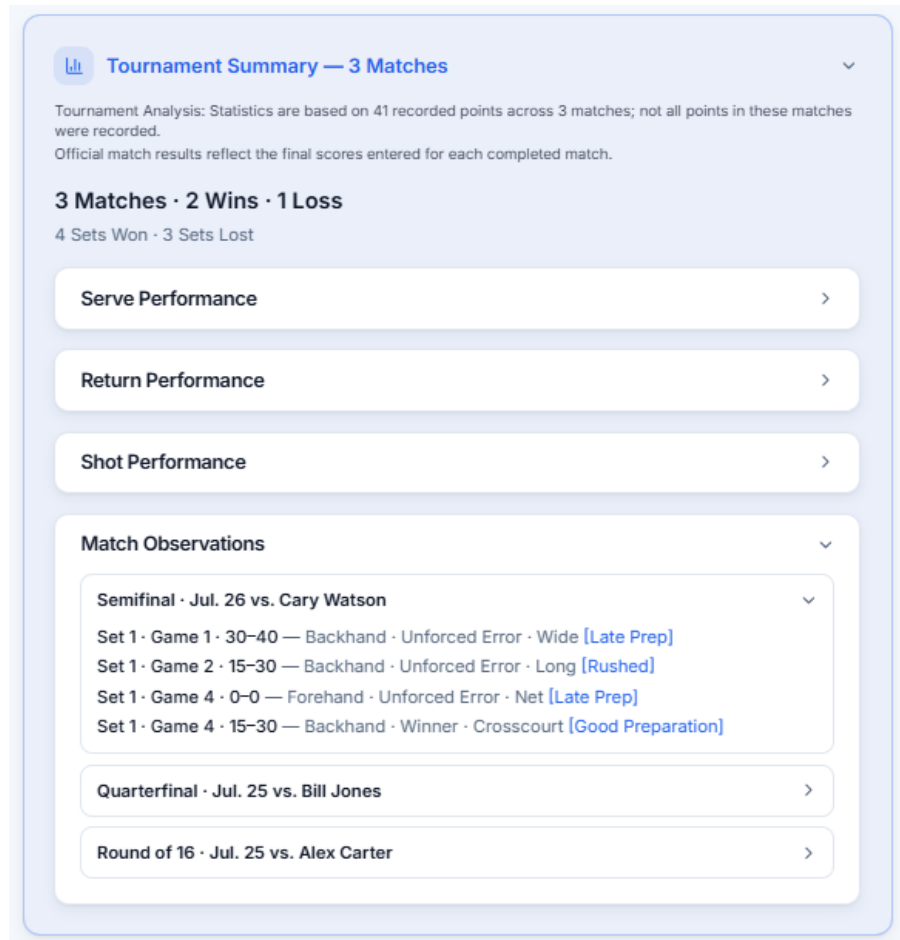

11. Performance Trends

Performance Trends helps you see whether a player's performance in a particular area is changing over time - not just what happened in one match.

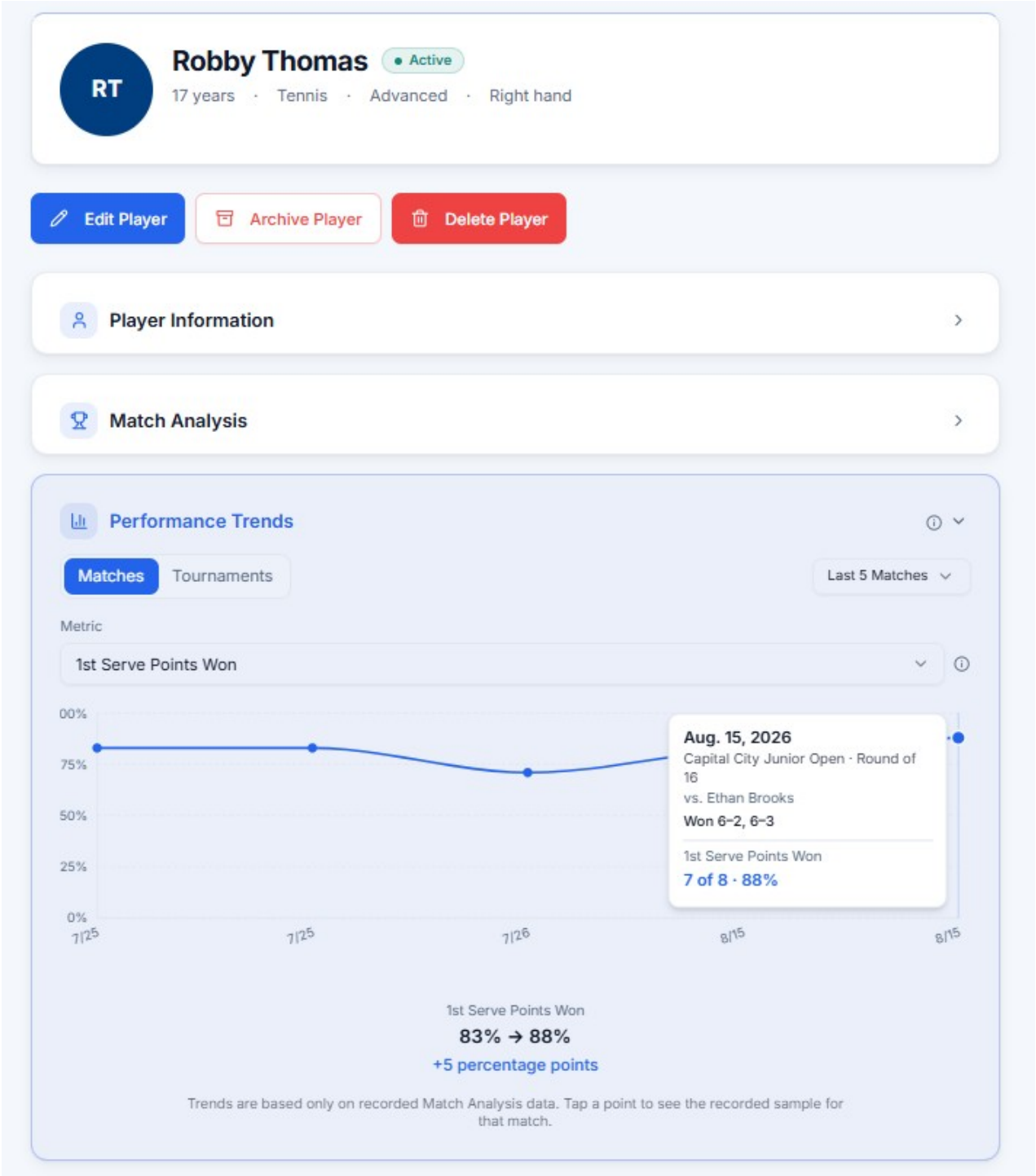
For example, is the player's second-serve performance gradually improving, staying about the same, or consistently underperforming? Are unforced errors becoming less frequent? Is return performance becoming more consistent from tournament to tournament?

By looking across multiple matches or tournaments, Performance Trends can help identify patterns that may be difficult to recognize while watching a single match.

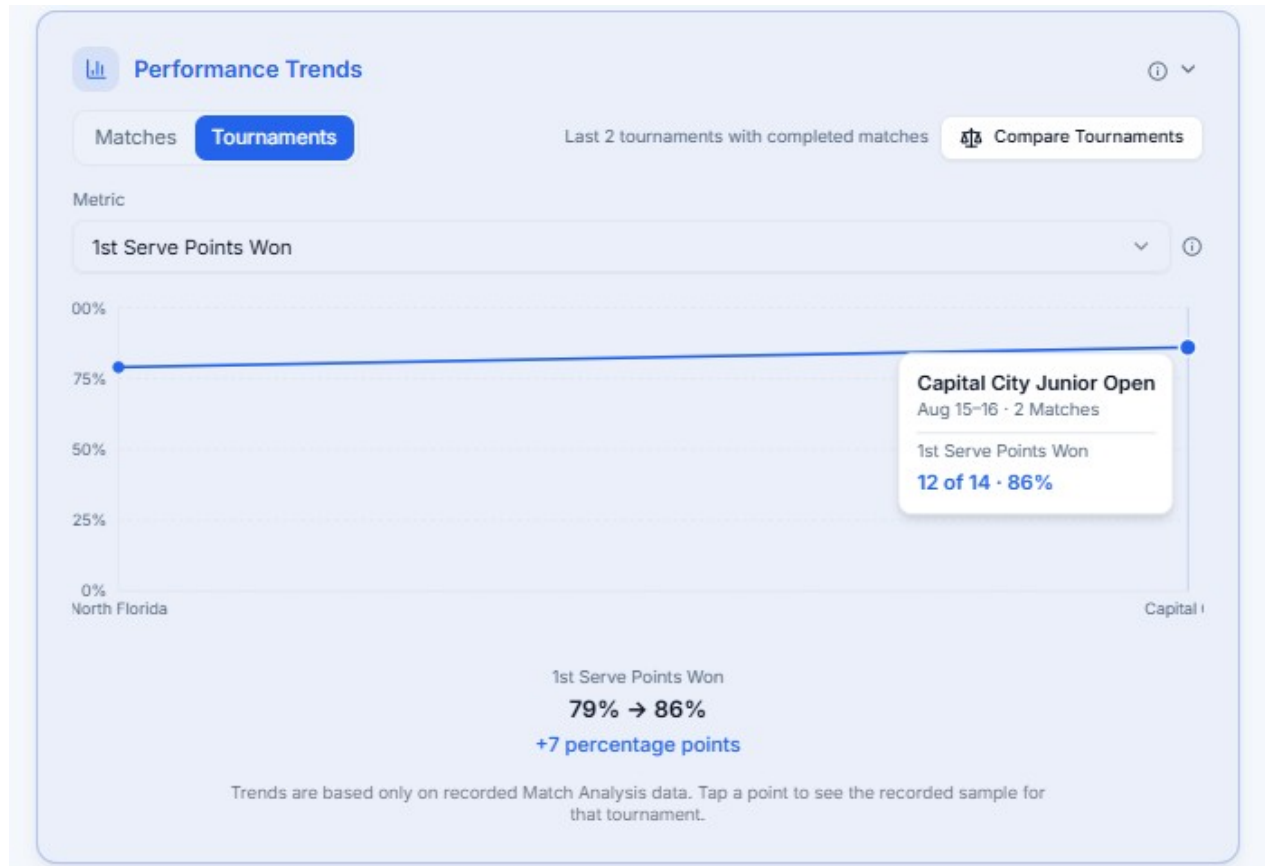
Look for patterns, not isolated numbers. One unusually high or low result may not mean much, especially when only part of a match was recorded.

The goal is not for the parent to diagnose the problem. Your input helps the app identify patterns over time and provides the coach with useful information to evaluate.

Tournament trends

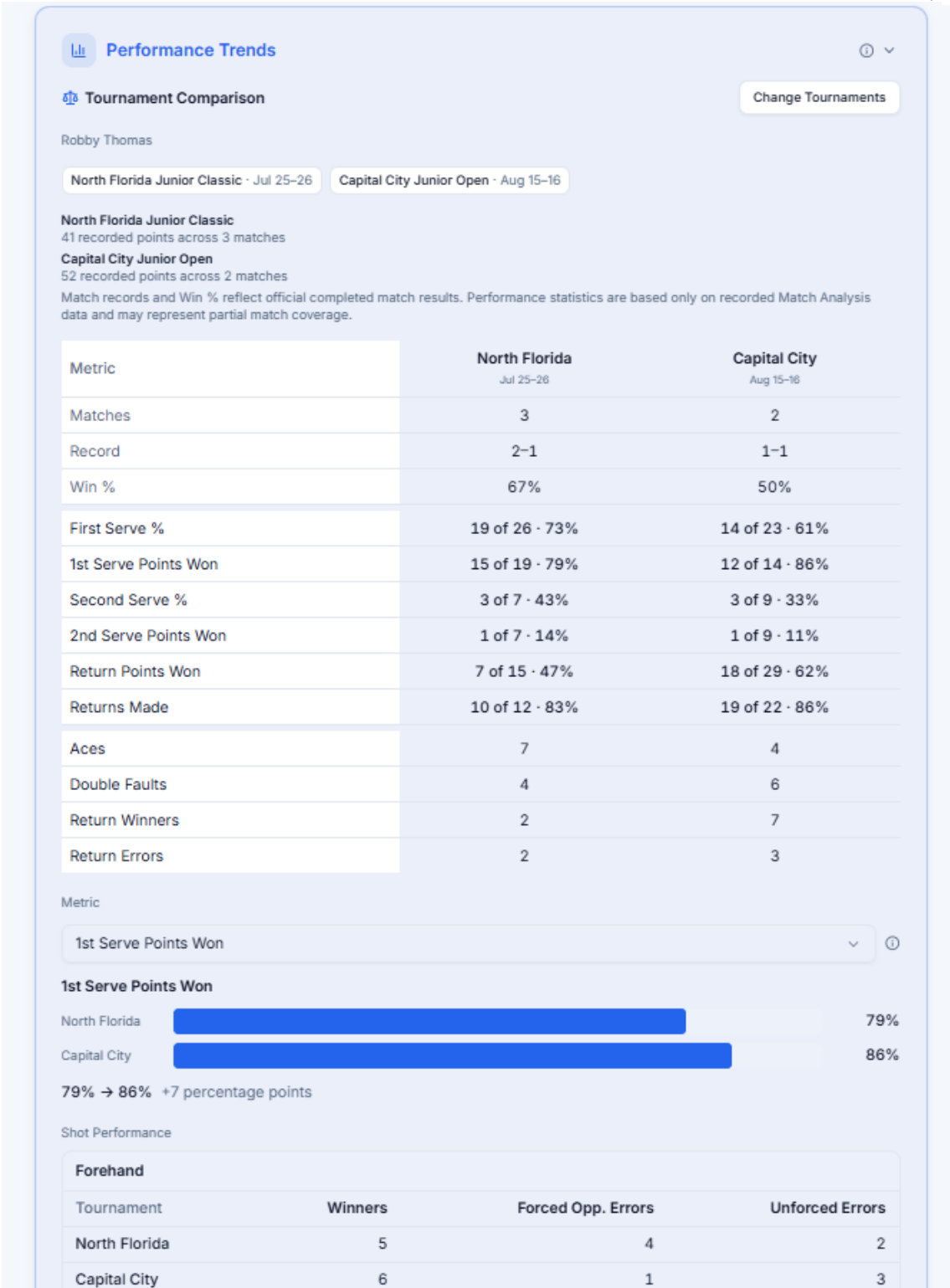


Tournament Trends compare aggregated performance from one tournament to the next.

Tournament Trends use the same transparency principle: the chart is based only on recorded Match Analysis data, and the point detail shows the sample behind the statistic.

12. Compare Tournaments

When at least two tournaments contain completed Match Analysis data, Compare Tournaments places the events side by side.



Tournament Comparison separates official results from performance statistics and shows recorded-data coverage.

The comparison includes match record and win percentage from official results, plus serve, return, and shot-performance statistics from recorded Match Analysis data.

Different tournaments may contain different amounts of recorded data. Coverage counts are shown so a parent or coach can interpret the comparison appropriately.

13. Sharing With the Coach

Racket Sports Parent is designed to turn courtside observations into information that can be shared with the coach without asking the parent to interpret the player's development.

From Tournament Details, select Send to Coach to generate a tournament report containing the official results and recorded Match Analysis information.

The most productive conversation is not 'Here is what I think you should fix.' It is 'Here is what I recorded and noticed during the match.'

14. Voice-to-Text

Capturing observations does not have to mean a lot of typing. Where your device keyboard provides a microphone, you can use its built-in voice-to-text capability to speak notes and observations while they are fresh in your mind.

Observe. Speak. Save. Share.

Voice-to-text is provided by your device keyboard, not by a separate Racket Sports Parent speech-recognition system. Review dictated text before saving, especially names and tennis terminology.

17. The Parent's Role

The strongest use of Racket Sports Parent is objective and collaborative. Record what happened, preserve useful observations, look for patterns over time, and share the information with the coach.

Be Part of Their Development - Without Becoming the Coach.

A parent does not need to diagnose technique or design the next practice. The app helps create a better connection between player, parent, and coach while keeping everyone focused on the role they do best.

A simple workflow to remember

PLAN -> OBSERVE -> RECORD -> REVIEW -> SHARE

As more Match Analysis data is collected, reports, trends, and comparisons become more useful. Always interpret the statistics in light of how much of each match was actually recorded.
